

Boren Speaks at Beta Dinner

Early in the spring semester, the Betas welcomed David Boren, leader and president of the University to a formal meal. Boren took time out of his busy schedule not only to dine with the men of Beta Theta Pi, but to speak on the status of the University and the direction OU is taking as a school.

President Boren spoke to the men about the academic standing of OU, the athletic program, and the future plans for the new Business and Meteorology buildings soon to be constructed.

Boren included a slide presentation in his remarks. He said growth in the research and development program is increasing OU's stature among both state colleges and Big 12 universities.

He said increasing the minimum requirements for admission to OU has caused more students to apply each year to OU. He said more than 90 per cent of Oklahoma Regents' Scholars attend OU.

After speaking, Boren took time to tour the house and tell old stories of how he would have been a Beta if he had participated in rush at OU. He spoke of other prominent Betas and his lasting friendships with them.

Not only did the Betas turn president Boren's head with our own achievements, but also made such an impression that he offered to assist

Gamma Phi in its future plans for capital improvements to the chapter house.

Chapter president Joe Ford worked very diligently with President Boren in setting up the meal, and he deserves credit for delivering such a prominent figure.
